## AUTOMATED TRAINING ON THE NET OR INTRANET

Ingenium Messenger from Meliora Systems can be used to coordinate training schedules and skill development planning. The program works over an organization's e-mail system or the Internet, so employees can check their skill inventories, register for training, and plan for future jobs at their convenience.

- ingenium page.




The last feature generates course catalogues in a Web-page format for distribution and enables class registration over the Internet or a corporate intranet.

The program covers appropriate and inappropriate uses of this communication tool. It explains

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

board, and face the audience without interfering with the television or computer screen.


