Preventing Theft





Ready, Set, Answer

Group reaction is Reactive System's aim with its new *Q System*. This computer-based group response system enables every trainee in a class to answer questions simultaneously. With the *Q System* hardware/software package, up to 128 trainees can res-

pond to questions via a keypad.

Each trainee uses the keypad to answer multiple choice questions posed by the instructor. The system immediately records the responses. These responses can be displayed as a color bar chart on a monitor or can be printed. The data can be grouped by question or group member, or can be ranked by score.

Since every member of the class must respond to every question, the system helps maintain a high level of participant attention. In addition, the immediate tabulation of responses lets the instructor pinpoint specific areas in which the material taught is or is not being absorbed. The instructor can adjust the lesson during class.

The system includes two keypad models. The first, Model 100, is a 10-button keypad (approximately six inches by three inches), with buttons numbered zero through nine. A blinking light indicates when trainees are to respond. Model 200, the same size, has a small LCD screen on top that lets the respondent view what he or she has entered. This model allows self-paced input so that trainees can respond to test questions at any pace and in any order. In addition to buttons zero through nine, Model 200 has five more buttons to delete an entry, request the instructor's assistance, send in the answer, view a previous entry, and let the trainee enter the question number and response all in one entry.

The Q System is used with the IBM-PC and XT and other compatible personal computers. The keypads are connected to the computer by standard telephone cable equipped with modular jacks. The system interface box connects to the host computer via an RS 232 port.

The Model 100 system sells for \$1,200, including eight keypads, manual, and software. The Model 200 sells for \$1,550. A packet of eight additional keypads is available for \$720 for the Model 100 and \$1,080 for the Model 200. The software available includes the Instant Feedback teaching package or the Instant Scoring testing package.



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
