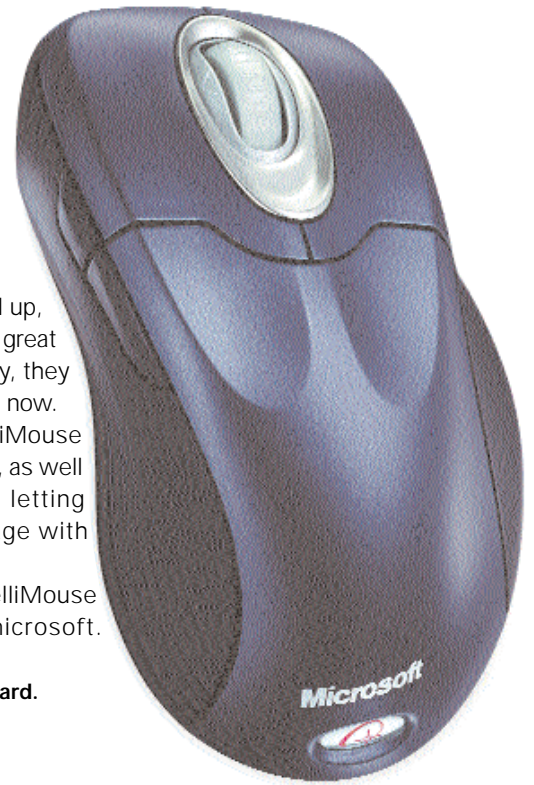
Move Aside
