

She is transformed from a anxiety-ridden subordinate into a confident, convincing presenter.

In her first run-through, Rachel stutters, stammers, and rambles. Then she over-prepares a canned speech. Finally, when she learns how to prepare properly for the presentation, she gives a winning presentation.

Throughout the video, Jenkins, Rachel's mentor, offers common sense advice such as breathing techniques, using note cards and props, maintaining eye contact, avoiding jargon, and dressing comfortably.

The 28-minute video includes a leader's guide that offers tips and suggested agendas for managing presentation skills training sessions. The long-term license purchase price is \$870. The one-to-five day rental price is \$250.
