Submission Description:	The MS Chapter holds a joint meeting with our GIGs each June. The joint meeting rotates among the Chapter/GIG locations. The Chapter also added to the By-Laws to incorporate GIG administration. Approval of the by-laws concerning financial matters eased Chapter relations with the GIGs.
Need Addressed:	CORE need for chapter administration and chapter need for involving GIG members in chapter activities.

The costs associated with this are for mileage and a meal. No overnight stay is required. There were no costs associated with changing the By-laws to include GIG administration. Travel costs for the June meeting vary depending on the location, but the hours allow for travel without an overnight stay. The hosting body is responsible for determining the theme, location, and speakers. Meeting dues have been the same as a monthly chapter meeting (\$15.00) for the past two years. The meeting dues cover food costs. Door prizes are donated.
How did you implement: (please give a	The first joint meeting was held in 2009 in Hattiesburg, which was

brief description)	the halfway point between the Chapter in Jackson and the only 2009 GIG on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. As a result of that meeting, a new GIG was formed in Hattiesburg.
What were the Outcomes: (include financial, membership increases, target audience satisfaction levels, publicity for the chapter, and of the profession)	Our most substantial outcome was the new GIG formed in Hattiesburg as a result of the first joing meeting.
Lessons Learned: (hints and tips for other chapters who may be considering a similar effort)	Financial administration presented the most difficult challenges we faced. The solution was to amend the by-laws to include GIG administration. All members (GIG members included) were allowed to comment on the changes. A vote to approve the by-laws was taken once the GIG and chapter had agreed on the changes specified.
