Gordon M. Bliss Award

Forrest R. Belcher, a management and training consultant, Tulsa, OK, has been an active member of ASTD for 25 years. In addition to being a past president of the Houston and Tulsa Chapters, he served for 10 years on the Society's National Board of Directors, including holding the national presidency in 1970.

Among the many accomplishments Forrest achieved before his retirement from Standard Oil Company earlier this year, was the establishment of the organization's Training Management and Organization Management Department. Previously there was no

centralized, coordinated training function within Standard — one of the largest corporations in America.

Forrest was instrumental in arranging ASTD's first real exploration of international training activities in 1962. Through his contacts in the Middle East, executive secretary Gordon Bliss visited trainers in Turkey and Egypt.

In connection with his inter-

national interest he chaired the International Committee for two years and worked closely with trainers in Latin America and Southeast Asia. He also chaired the First International Training and Development Conference in Geneva, Switzerland, out of which emerged IFTDO.

Many of Forrest's contributions

to the world of training have been through his employer and ASTD.

He has worked with many volunteer organizations on leadership, communications and team building. Just within the last year he has trained supervisory teams in the Oklahoma Welfare Department; innovated team-building and problem identification with a black theatre group; and visited various campuses to talk with students about careers in the training profession.

He is the founder and present head of the Woodlands Group, a voluntary, non-profit organization of leading training consultants and directors that

meets quarterly to consider training issues in our organizations and society. He also helped design three National ASTD Conferences: Miami in 1969, Anaheim in 1970 and Anaheim again in 1980.

Established to perpetuate the memory of ASTD's first executive director, the Gordon M. Bliss Memorial Award is the highest an individual can receive from ASTD.
