"WE'RE MOVING . . ."

By now, most of you have heard that the American Society for Training and Development is, in fact, relocating its national headquarters from Madison, Wis. to Washington, D.C. and, of course, that means the *Journal* editorial offices will also be making the move.

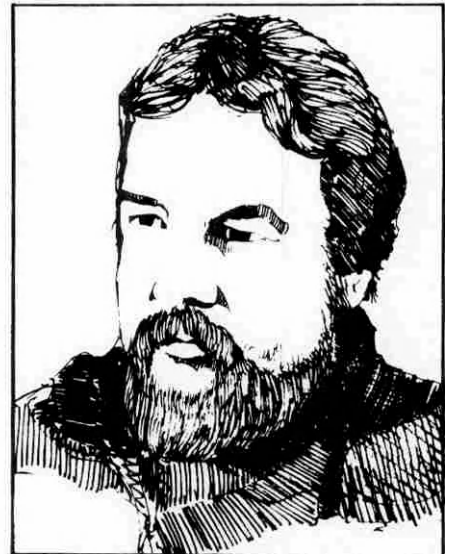
Acting on a decision to relocate, made last August by the Society's Board of Directors, a downtown Washington, D.C. site, only three blocks from the U.S. Capitol Building, was chosen. The association will be leasing more than 13,000 square feet of space in the new Capital Gallery Building, located on Maryland Avenue.

Located in the midst of Washington's business district, the new

location is within walking distance of several government offices — including the Department of Education, the General Services Administration, the Federal Office Building, etc.

The L'Enfant Plaza Metro Station, a part of Washington's new public transportation system, is located directly beneath Capital Gallery's plaza. By car or metro, Union Station is 14 minutes away and National Airport 22 minutes away.

Society headquarters, including the *Journal* editorial offices, will be closed from August 15 through August 24 to facilitate the relocation. After the 24th, the association's new address will be: American Society for Training and De-



velopment, Suite 305, 600 Maryland Ave. S.W., Washington, D.C. 20024. All correspondence should carry this address as of Friday, August 14. The Society's new phone number will be published in the September issue of the *Journal*.
