37% of the women polled have worn a skirt to work without the benefit of underwear

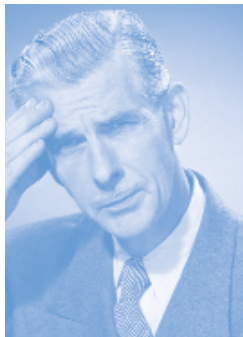
40% have spied on their boss, typically by reading a memo on his or her desk
