flipchart and a few overheads just don't make the grade anymore.

In a recent online discussion among training professionals, many were lamenting the lack of quality and impact of many of the presentations they see. Generally, they said that most presentations lack pizzazz. But how can that be, considering all of the glitzy off-the-shelf presentation-software packages that are out there?

Perhaps the growing range and increasing sophistication make presentation software seem too high-tech if you aren't a computer whiz or graphics guru. But, in fact, most packages are designed to be easy to use.

It's important to remember that presentations are still about show and tell, but with expanded possibilities—thanks to such multimedia capabilities as graphics, animation, video, and sound. The *show* has progressed from aiming a pointer at a flipchart to electronic displays with moving

BEST TIPS

Here are some tips from Microsoft for using PowerPoint 97:

- To change the same presentation for different audiences, Custom Show lets users designate which slides for which audience. PowerPoint 97 will show only those slides and save all of the versions in one custom show, making it easy to locate multiple versions and save hard disk and network resources.
- ▶ The Pack and Go wizard of Power-Point 97 can compress a presentation, including sounds and video linked to it, and then spread it across multiple floppy disks. You just run pngsetup.exe on the first floppy and your presentation will be restored to its full fidelity.

Here are some specific tips from Lotus for using Freelance Graphics 97:

- When commenting on a file in TeamReview mode and space is a factor, create a quick comment notation. That will automatically size the box to your comments.
- SmartIcons speed up work considerably. One set remains throughout the process; the second set is task-specific, changing to accommodate the job at hand.
- Check the Lotus Web site for plugins and options. You can view a Free-

lance Graphics presentation and use the Save-and-Go option to save one or more compressed presentations to floppy disks or specific drives.

Here are some general presentation tips from Software Publishing's *The Simple Art of Presentation!* featuring Harvard Graphics:

Preparation.

- What? Be clear about the ideas you want to present.
- Why? Is your message important enough to take people away from work? Stick to motivational or broad concepts, not nitty-gritty detail.
- ▶ Who? Who should present, not always obvious, and who is going to be the audience?
- When? Try not to present before or after lunch or too early for travelers. Don't intrude on people's key work times.
- Where? In-house is more convenient, but be sure to visit an external facility before the presentation.
- How? Choose materials and visuals that complement the content and your presentation style.
