Richard H. Marcotte, manager of Maintenance Training at American Airlines, Inc., Tulsa, OK, has been an active ASTD member for 26 years. In addition to being a past president of the Tulsa Green Country Chapter, he served six years on the Society's National Board of Directors, including holding the national presidency in 1977.

During Marcotte's presidency, the Society experienced: the largest membership growth rate in history; the chartering of five new chapters; a long overdue membership dues increase; and the adoption of an Affirmative Action Policy.

At American Airlines, Marcotte received the 1977 Distinguished Service Award Certificate of Commendation for the development of a series of "superior maintenance programs"

over a period of 30 years, and for rendering "outstanding service" as president of the American Society for Training and Development which won wide acclaim throughout the industry and en-

He was recently honored by the Spartan School of Aeronautics in Tulsa as the "outstanding graduate" from their Aircraft Maintenance School. This award was presented during the school's 50th anniversary celebration. Over 50,000 students have graduated from Spartan.

The Gordon M. Bliss Memorial Award is the highest award an individual can receive from ASTD. It was established to perpetuate the memory of ASTD's first executive director.
