EDUCATION PROGRAM PROPOSALS SOUGHT

In December 1973, the ASTD Board of Directors, ASTD chapter presidents and all OD Division members were solicited for proposals from chapters on OD education programs such as "How to start an OD interest group" and other specialized topics that would interest chapter members.

Seed money, amounting up to \$500 each for the best four proposals has been offered. The deadline for submitting proposals is Jan. 31, 1974. A chapter submitting a proposal must also include an outline of how the seed money would be spent if the proposal was selected.



**OD BIBLIOGRAPHY
BEING PREPARED**

An updated bibliography of practical OD concepts and techniques is currently in the preparation stage. The publication is slated for distribution to all ASTD-OD Division members in late Spring, 1974. The text of the publication is being organized to act as a ready-made reference source of information on specific topics such as MBO, job enrichment or open systems approaches.

ABUNDANT**

Even if there is trouble agreeing on what exactly OD is, there seems to be an abundance of forums in which people are sharing their uncertainties with each other.

Along with ASTD and NTL conferences, the Academy of Management has gotten into OD programming at national and regional conferences. Craig Lundberg, 1973 ASTD OD Executive Committee member, is also serving as 1973 chairperson for the Academy's OD Division. Both the Eastern and Southeastern regions of the American Institute for Decision Sciences feature OD on upcoming programs.

What all this means for practitioners is new ideas, new research data and, hopefully, therefore, more leverage on the unsolved problems of introducing change. Of course, it also means the practitioner will continue to have the problems of distinguishing the "good stuff from the garbage," but maybe it's better to have the problem than to be living in a frozen world of dogma.

**ASTD EFFORTS
COMMENDED**

Set aside some reading and reflection time in March for the second special issue of the *Journal* devoted exclusively to OD. Judging by the reception of the first issue in January 1973, these special issues are a highly popular policy of *Journal* editors.
