Addressograph Multigraph Dedicates Million Dollar Training Center

SCHAUMBURG, Ill. – A million dollar, 30,000 sq. ft. training center containing some of the very latest equipment for industrial education was dedicated here today by Addressograph Multigraph Corporation. Attending the dedication were dignitaries representing local, state and national government; interested general and trade publications; public and vocational education; and business and industry.

During the course of a year, more than 1,500 AM sales and service personnel will receive training in this new facility. Approximately 150 specialized classes will be conducted, providing more than 4,500 man-weeks of instruction to AM employees charged with providing maintenance and service to products sold or leased to the company's customers throughout the country.

All of the service training and much of the sales training related to products manufactured and sold by AM's Bruning, Multigraphics and VariTyper Divisions is being conducted in this training center. Some training of customer personnel also is conducted here, principally to U. S. Government personnel or others who are or may be "beyond the reach" of AM's 64 widely-scattered service branches across America. Usually, these are Government or business offices outside the continental United States.


AM's new training center occupies two floors of a modern five-story office building and encompasses eight classrooms, 10 machine work areas, and two role-playing areas, used primarily in sales training. It is equipped to produce video cassette programs, 35mm slide presentations with sound cassettes, and DuKane 35mm film strips with sound.

'Ice Cream' Training Units Now Span the Continent
